1. OVERVIEW OF NDA

The National development Agency is a public entity listed under Schedule 3A of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA). It was established in terms of the National Development Agency Act No 108 of 1998 as amended.

1.1. Our mandate

In terms of the National Development Agency (NDA) Act (Act No 108 of 1998 as amended), NDA was mandated to contribute towards the eradication of poverty and its causes by granting funds to Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) to:

- Implement development projects in poor communities, and
- Strengthen the institutional capacity of other CSOs that provide services to poor communities.

Facilitate sustainable development by strengthening Civil Society Organisations involved in poverty eradication through enhanced grant funding and research.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1. Introduction

The National Development Agency (NDA) is required by section 13 of the National Archives and Records Service of South Africa Act No. 43 of 1996, as Amended, to manage its records in a well-structured record keeping system, and to put the necessary policies and procedures in place to ensure that its record keeping and records management practices comply with the requirements of the Act.

The NDA has embarked on the implementation of ICT governance, cloud computing and mobile solutions; which requires adherence to privacy legislation and effective implementation of information security and is required to protect its Information and Information resources to avoid a disruption in service delivery and to minimize business continuity risks and liabilities. Challenges currently experienced are listed below but are not limited to this list:

Current Records Management Challenges

- a) Poor management and control for movement of documents between NDA offices
- b) Poor Document and Records Management System
- c) Documents are not easily available, searchable or destroyed.
- d) No proper Registries and records are stored in open offices or where access can be obtained.
- e) No back-ups or disaster prevention in place (physical paper files)
- f) Scanning not done according to procedures
- g) There is no approved File Plan implemented
- h) Poor uniformed document management system for the entire organization

3. PURPOSE OF THE BID

The purpose of the request for bids is to appoint suitable service providers for the records and storage management services.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

4.1. Establish an integrated records management system for the organization as follows:

- 4.1.1. Provide consulting services to manage and guide the process until the system is running smoothly
- 4.1.2. Conduct records management analysis
- 4.1.3. Conduct an audit on available information
- 4.1.4. Develop a file plan with of a unique classification system
- 4.1.5. Develop records management guidelines and procedures to have a retrievable filing system
- 4.1.6. To assist the NDA to align their business with the Act that regulates records management (e.g. National & Records Services Act and the ISO standards)
- 4.1.7. To ensure business continuity when taking over from the current service provider.
- 4.1.8. Storage environment with limited access, are fire-proof, environmentally controlled and constantly monitored by CCTV cameras.
- 4.1.9. Provide Archive management services off-site and on-site.
- 4.1.10. Provision of physical files with classifications according to the file plan (e.g. red for Finance, yellow for personal/HR files, etc)
- 4.1.11. Destruction of documents
- 4.1.12. Review NDA's current Records Management policy. Identify deficiencies and provide recommendations.

4.2. Back-up and Storage Management

Provide the following:

- 4.2.1. Secured and Protected containers (30 containers) for tapes when transported offsite. A container must take a minimum of 5 tapes. A minimum of 4 containers for Daily, 4 containers for Weekly, 12 containers for Monthly and 10 containers for Yearly
- 4.2.2. 24/7 Support required
- 4.2.3. 2-Hour response time for delivery of tapes to the NDA Head Office in response to requests logged.
- 4.2.4. A scheduled drop off and collection services (Monday to Friday) before 11:00 am

- Advise on back-up and recovery of electronic information in terms of the ISO 4.2.5. standards
- Ensure that the data is in a secure location that is distinct from the source data. 426

4.3. Service Provider Footprint

Participating Service providers must have a national footprint. NDA has 16 offices with 3 more offices to be opened in the coming 8-months. The required services will be provided to all these offices. The location of the offices is as follows:

5. PROPOSED PROJECT DURATION

The proposed service should be implemented within 10 months from the date of appointment.

6.1 Clarification of the above score system

Specifications = Total of 45 points (4.1 & 4.2)

Service providers should have the required minimum requirements detailed in section 4.1 of this document to get the full 45 points (3 points per requirement, excluding 4.1.7). The same will apply for 4.2 (2 points per requirement). Service providers must provide confirmation of the required info.

National footprint = Total of 10 points (4.3)

Participating Service providers must have a national footprint (An office per province), confirmation should be by providing physical addresses of these offices. A total of 10 points will be allocated to this. Zero points will be allocated for non-compliance to this requirement.

• Business Continuity = Total of 10 points

Service Providers must provide a detail work plan with activities, timelines and deliverables within the scope of work and a separate plan on how to take over the current services from the current service provider with minimum interruptions of NDA's operation. If the submitted plan does not provide all the listed requirements, a score of zero will be allocated.

• Experience = Total of 10 points

The Bidders should provide two (2) reference letters on the client's letterhead, written and signed by the previous and current clients indicating. The reference letters provide full details of services rendered and duration. Each reference letter will be allocated 5 points.

Skills Transfers = Total of 13 points

Service Providers must provide a framework on transferring the records management skills to the identified champions to continue with the records management post the implementation. A total of 14 points will be allocated to frameworks that provide detailed skills transfer. A score of zero (0) will be allocated for failure to submit this.

Note: Shortlisted service providers might be invited for presentations at the NDA head office.

7. COMMERCIAL EVALUATION

- 7.1. Bids will be evaluated in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, using the 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA, Act 5 of 2000). The lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price and maximum of 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution.
- 7.2. The bid proposals received will be evaluated in two (2) phases. On the first phase bids will be evaluated on functionality and on the second phase in accordance with the 80/20 preference points system respectively.

- 7.3. Bid proposal must score a minimum of eighty (80) points or more out of hundred (100) points on functionality in order to qualify for advancement to the next phase of evaluation. Second phase, a bid proposal scoring less than 80 out of 100 will not be considered for further evaluation and will be disqualified.
- 7.4. Phase two: During this phase, bid proposals that passed the first phase will be further evaluated based on the 80/20 preference points system in accordance with the PPPFA Act, where 80 points will be attained in respect of price (the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points and bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis) and 20 points will be awarded for attaining the Broad-Based Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 7.5. In order to claim the B-BBEE Status Level of Contributor, bidders must submit Sworn Affidavits or original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof, issued by accredited Verification Agencies such as SANAS or Registered Auditor approved by the IRBA together with their bids, to substantiate their B-BBEE claims. Exempted Micro Enterprises must submit a letter from the Accounting Officer who is appointed in terms of the Close Corporation Act.
- 7.6. Bidders who do not submit B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate or are non-compliant contributors to B-BBEE do not qualify for preference points for B-BBEE, but will not be disqualified from the bidding process. They will score points out of 80 for price only and zero (0) points out of 20 for B-BBEE.
- 7.7. Bidders are requested to complete the preference claim form (SBD 6.1 and 6.2) in order to claim preference points.

7.8. The highest ranked bidder will be awarded the bid. It should be noted also that the NDA reserves the right not to appoint any service provider and no service provider will be reimbursed for any costs incurred whilst participating in this bid.

7.9. Pricing

- 7.9.1. Service providers must give a detailed cost breakdown for all applicable costs e.g. Initial setup costs, Escalation costs and any other additional charges.
- 7.9.2. Service providers must indicate if their prices will be fixed and firm for the duration of the proposed contract period, if not, the proposed escalations should be clearly indicated on the proposal/quotation. All prices submitted must be inclusive of VAT.
- 7.9.3. Service Providers must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as NDA will not rectify any errors and no adjustments to quotations received will be permitted after the closing date. The quotes should include all activities/services that will be required for the required services as no variations will be accepted unless mutually agreed by NDA and the service provider prior to contract acceptance.
- 7.9.4. Service providers will carry the responsibility of ensuring that the proposals submitted have been signed by a dully authorised person. Should it be established after the submission of proposals that the signatory authorising the proposal is not legally appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.
- 7.9.5. All prices submitted should be typed in black ink or written in pen. No proposals written in pencil will be accepted or evaluated. Prices must show the total bid amount with vat included.

8. NDA PAYMENT TERMS

Invoices will be paid 30-days from the date of submission.

8.1. Mandatory Documents

- 8.1.1. Price offer.
- 8.1.2. Valid Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services (SARS) --- SARS tax pin and compliant CSD Report.
- 8.1.3. A letter/resolution authorising the person signing the bid documents and contracts.
- 8.1.4. Company registration documents (CIPC).

- 8.1.5. Certified Sworn Affidavits or BEE verification certificate (Issued by an approved verification agency).
- 8.1.6. Completed and signed SBD documents.

8.1.7. ID copies of directors

Failure to submit the above requirements with the bid document will lead to the disqualification. There will be no disqualification for none submission of a BEE certificate/sworn affidavit but service providers who do not submit will be scored zero (0) points for B-BBEE.

9. OTHER CONDITIONS

- 9.1 The Agency reserves the right not to accept the lowest bid during the bidding process.
- 9.2 The Agency reserves the right to return late bid submissions unopened.
- 9.3 The Agency reserves the right to cancel or not to award the bid to any supplier and participating service providers will not be reimbursed for expenses incurred while participating in the bid process.
- 9.4 The bid documents will be valid for 120-days from the date of submission. No regret letters will be issued to any participating service providers. The successful service provider will be announce on the NDA website and on the newspaper where the Ad was published.

10. TENDER VALIDITY

All submitted bids must be valid for 150-days from date of submission.

11. CONTRACTING

- 11.1 Upon the finalization of the property selection process. NDA's legal department shall sign the lease agreement herein referred to as Annexure "C".
- 11.2 All discussions and negotiations regarding the contents of the lease agreement shall be done with NDA's legal department.

12. DISCLAIMER

- 12.1 If a bidder finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in the bid or any other information provided by the NDA (other than minor clerical matters), the bidder must promptly notify NDA in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford the NDA an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).
- 12.2 Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this bid or any other information provided by the NDA will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all bidders without attribution to the bidder who provided the written notice.

TAX CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS
